Local Law to Amend Section 240-34 of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville to Decrease the Membership of the Village of Lyndonville Zoning Board of Appeals

- Section 1.** This Local Law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 7 of section 7-712 of the Village Law of the State of New York, which empowers a village to enact a local law to decrease the membership of a village zoning board which has five members to three members.
- Section 2.** Under the provisions of section 240-34 of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville, the Village of Lyndonville has five members on the zoning board. It is the purpose of this local law to decrease the membership of the zoning board to three.
- Section 3.** Section 240-34 of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville is hereby amended so as to provide that the Zoning Board of the Village of Lyndonville shall be reduced in size from five members to three members, to take effect upon the next two expirations of terms. No incumbent shall be removed from office except upon the expiration of his or her term.
- Section 4.** This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Department of State.




