Churchville Fire Equipment quoted \$5,499.00 for one complete set, MSA , G1 cylinder, face piece and four point harness. The Fire Department needs to replace 7 sets at this time. Trustee Woodward noted it would be \$40,883.00 for 7 complete Scott Air Pack sets from Dival, no written quote was provided. Trustee Woodward Jr. stated that Churchville Fire Equipment and Dival are the only suppliers for air packs. Trustee Woodward Jr. recommended going with Dival since the Lyndonville Fire Department currently has all Scott air packs and all other districts in the County currently all have Scott air packs as well so everything would be compatible. Trustee Woodward Jr. noted that per the Public Safety Committee meeting that the money to purchase the seven sets of gear would be taken out the Village's Fire Reserve account with NYCLASS.

SUPPORTING ASSEMBLYMAN HAWLEY'S OPPOSITION TO THE FREE TABLET PROGRAM FOR PRISONERS

WHEREAS, as a result of the decision by the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) to allow over 51,000 inmates statewide to use electronic tablets free of charge, Assemblyman Hawley has written a letter to Governor Cuomo and DOCCS demanding that the program be shut down immediately and to reconsider the misguided policy and urge JayP Inc. to work with our school system, libraries and veterans organizations to furnish tablets to law abiding citizens; now be it

RESOLVED, that this Legislature supports Assemblyman Hawley's position in opposing the free tablet program to statewide inmates housed in our New York State Correctional facilities; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Orleans County Legislature also demands that this program be shut down immediately and the tablets be used for law abiding citizens, students in our schools, provided to our library systems, or veterans organizations.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature shall forward copies of this resolution to Governor Andrew M. Cuomo, Senator Robert Ort, Assemblyman Steve Hawley, Assemblyman Michael Norris, New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision and all others deemed necessary and proper.
