A Local Law Regulating Door-to-Door Solicitors

SECTION 1. Definitions:

- (A) "Solicitor" shall mean any person, including an employee or agent of another or of any corporation, partnership or other entity, who travels from door-to-door, house-to-house, or along any streets within the Village of Lyndonville:
 - (1) Selling or taking orders for or offering to sell or take orders for goods, merchandise wares or services or other items or products, or
 - (2) Requesting contribution or donation of funds, property or anything of value, or the pledge of any type of future donation, or selling or offering for sale any type of property, including but not limited to goods, tickets, books, and pamphlets, for political, charitable, religious or other non-commercial purposes.
- (B) "Solicitation activities" shall mean the activities of solicitors as listed in (A) (1) and (2) of this section.

SECTION II. <u>License Required</u>. It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to engage in solicitation activities in the Village of Lyndonville without first obtaining a license from the Village Clerk.

SECTION III. Exceptions.

- (A) Minors under the age of 18 who participate in solicitation activities are exempt from the licensing and bonding requirements of this chapter except when they are acting as agents of adults or other entities.
- (B) "Non-for-profit," charitable and religious corporations, clubs and associations shall be exempt from the licensing requirements of this chapter including the payment fees. Before commencing any fund drive the organization, unless the membership is made up of 50% or more of Village of Lyndonville or Town of Yates residents, shall file with the Village Clerk the dates of solicitation, and the names and addresses of each individual soliciting. Individuals soliciting for not-for-profit, charitable and religious purposes must refrain from soliciting if the premises is posted with a sign bearing the words "No Peddlers," "No Solicitors," or words of similar import.
- (C) Those companies involved in the sale of insurance are exempt from the licensing and bonding requirements, including the payments of fees. Before commencing any solicitation activities, the persons included shall register at the office of the Village Clerk the dates of solicitation, the vehicles to be used and proof of identity.
- **SECTION IV.** Application. The application for a solicitor's license shall be made on a form provided by the Village Clerk and shall contain all information relevant and necessary to determine whether a particular license may be issued, including but not limited to:
 - (A) Proof of identity and residence address of the applicant;
- (B) A brief description of the nature, character and quality of the goods or merchandise to be sold;
- (C) If solicitor is employed by another, the name and business address of such person, firm, association, organization, company or corporation.
 - (D) Any other requested information.
- **SECTION V.** <u>Fees and Duration</u>. An applicant for a license under this ordinance shall pay an annual license fee of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) per solicitor. A solicitation license shall be valid for a period of 1 year.

SECTION VI. Licenses.

(A) The license issued to a solicitor shall be carried with the solicitor while he or she is engaged in the business of soliciting.

- (B) License shall not be assignable to any other person. It is only to be used by the person to whom it is issued, as depicted on the application.
- **SECTION VII.** <u>Regulations</u>. The following regulation apply to solicitors engaged in solicitation activities in the Village of Lyndonville:
- (A) Solicitors shall be allowed to conduct solicitation activities only between the hours of sunrise and sunset.
- (B) No person shall engage in business as a solicitor in defiance of any notice exhibited by a residence or business indicating that solicitors are not welcome or not invited.

SECTION VIII. Suspension or Revocation of License.

- (A) Any license issued under this ordinance may be suspended or revoked by the Village Clerk for any of the following reasons:
 - (1) Fraud or misrepresentation in the application for a license;
 - (2) Fraud or misrepresentation in the course of conducting solicitation activities;
 - (3) Conducting solicitation activities contrary to the conditions of the license;
- (4) Conducting solicitation activities in such manner as to create a public nuisance or constitute a danger to public health, safety or welfare.
- (B) Upon suspension or revocation, the Village Clerk shall deliver written notice to the license holder stating the action taken and the reasons supporting such action. The written notice shall be mailed to the license holder's place of business or mailed to the license holder's last known address, by first class mail.
- **SECTION IX.** Appeals. Persons who are denied licenses or who licenses have been suspended or revoked may appeal by filing written notice of appeal with the Village. The appeal must be filed within 10 days after receipt of the notice of denial, suspension, or revocation. The Village Board shall hear and determine the appeal and the decision of the Village Board shall be final. The license shall remain suspended until the decision of the Village Board.
- **SECTION X.** Penalties. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$250.00 (Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars), or by imprisonment not to exceed 15 days, or both.
- **SECTION XI.** <u>Limitations</u>. Nothing herein shall authorize or require the Village of Lyndonville, its employees, representatives or agents, to investigate the character of any individual soliciting in the Village, and issuance of a license shall not be construed to imply approval, endorsement or support of any solicitor and no solicitor shall represent otherwise.

SECTION XII. Severance Clause. The provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, sentence, clause, or phase of this ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decisions shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance, but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the validity of any part.

SECTION XIII. Repeal. Chapter 121 of the Code of the Village of Lyndonville, New York entitled "Hawking, Peddling and Soliciting" is hereby REPEALED.

This local law shall take effect upon its proper filing as required by law.
